12 Ways to honor St. Joseph this March

- 1. For your special intentions, pray to St. Joseph
- 2. Honor your fathers. In Italy and Spain, Father's Day is celebrated annually on St. Joseph's Day. This is the perfect day for you to honor the older man in your life who has guided you, deepened your faith, or helped you. Send a card describing your gratitude, call them up, make them dinner, offer a Mass in their honor.
- **3.** Resolve to work smarter this month. As a way befitting the patron saint of work, offer up your labor out of love and gratitude for St. Joseph. Remember that keeping holy the Sabbath and obstaining form labor on Sunday honors St. Joseph, too!
- **4.** Place an icon, statue, or image of St. Joseph on your table. Put a treasured picture of our own family beside it as a way of seeking blessings and intercession from St. Joseph, Pillar of Families.
- **5.** Make Wednesdays special In the Catholic tradition, Wednesday is the day of the week devoted to St. Joseph. Make your Wednesdays this March extra special by attending Mass. What a better month to begin the Nine First Wednesdays tradition in honor of St. Joseph?
- 6. Make a St. Joseph's Day Altar. This is a meaningful traditions for all Catholics to celebrate the feast day. Make it as simple or elaborate as you'd like with a St. Joseph statue and candles. Add special foods such as bread shaped as crosses, figs, olives, dates, fruits, artichokes and salads to have a St. Joseph Day feast!
- **7.** Adorn your St. Joseph's Day altar, or anywhere in your home, an Easter Lily.
- **8.** Find a way to include St. Joseph in the décor of your home. Have a framed work of religious art featuring St. Joseph in your home or add a statue of St. Joseph in your garden.
- 9. Read the "Consecration to St. Joseph" by Fr. Donald Calloway.
- **10.** Find ways to give. Contact local Catholic organizations to donate.
- **11.** Pray for the sick and suffering.

Dear friends.

Evangelization can sometimes feel intimidating! Our encounters with sin and brokenness in this crazy, upsidedown world can lead us wondering if we are "educated enough," "holy enough" or "articulate enough" to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Maybe, deep down, we even secretly wonder if the Gospel is even powerful enough to penetrate the dysfunction of sin in our fallen world.

When we experience tepidity and a lack of faith in evangelization, it's usually because we have not experienced the saving power of Jesus Christ in our own life. Sure, we may go to church, but many of us have not surrendered to Jesus the thing He wants most: our heart.

In today's Gospel, the Samaritan woman lets Jesus encounter her in her brokenness. Jesus knows she has a colorful past and probes the most shame-filled and tender areas of her heart. In this beautiful exchange, the Samaritan woman discovers someone who fully knows her and still fully loves her. This encounter compels the woman to change and it leads her to invite others to encounter Christ: "Come see a man..."

The Samaritan becomes an evangelist not despite her brokenness, *but because of it.*

Brother and sisters, what sin causes you the most shame? What addictions do you hide? Do you have faith to believe that your mission and purpose in the Kingdom of God are linked to Jesus touching and healing your wounds? We can only share in the saving work of Jesus to the extent that we have experienced Christ's saving work in our hearts.

This lent, give Jesus your heart. Let Him encounter you in your brokenness. Discover His love. Allow yourself to be healed. Experience the Gospel POWER. Like the Samaritan woman, you will discover that evangelization is something you no longer "do," but something you naturally exude.

Take a risk, give Jesus your heart, and watch your faith grow and kingdom mission come alive.
