Saint John Paul II

May 18th, 2020 we celebrate Saint Pope John Paul II who would have been 100 years old this year. Born Karol Wojtyla in Poland during it's invasion by the Nazis, Pope John Paul would become "an intrepid pilgrim for peace." "After much soul-searching, this athletic and brilliant student chose the path of priesthood. Having been a young priest, a young bishop, and a young cardinal, in 1978 he became, not surprisingly, a young pope! Like none other, he bore words of hope to peoples all over the world. This pope, who led the Church for a quarter of a century, always enjoyed the support of the young."

St. Bernardine of Siena

This Wednesday May 20th is the feast of St. Bernardine of Siena (1380—1444).



Born in Northern Italy during the time of the plague. At 20, he presented himself at the hospital, not as someone who was ill, but to help. Soon he gathered up some friends to do the same. Later, he became a Franciscan priest. Because of his understanding of the needs of the people to learn about vice and virtue, his sermons were very well attended. He was popular,

friendly, a scholar and a teacher, as well as very devoted to his faith. He was end-lessly devoted to the Holy Name of Jesus, as well as St. Joseph. About him he once wrote: What then, is Joseph's position in the whole Church of Christ? Is he not a man chosen and set apart? Through him and, Yes, under him, Christ was fittingly and honorably introduced into the world. Holy Church in its entirety is indebted to the Virgin Mother, because it is through her it was judged worth to receive Christ. But after her we undoubtedly owe special gratitude and reverence to St. Joseph. St. Bernardine's devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus inspired him to draft the symbol 'IHS', the first three letters of Jesus' name in Greek superimposed in the rays of a sun.

St. Bernardine, who lived through the medieval plague, pray for us!

Bishop announces that churches can be open for individual prayer and Adoration.

St. Stanislaus is now open daily from 10 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. Precautions still apply:

No more than 10 people may be present at one time. Individuals need to be separated from each other by at least 6 feet. Volunteers are monitoring this.

Hand sanitizer is available at the entrance of the church and will be encouraged.

Certain pews will be marked with signs and these will be sanitized daily. Adoration should take place in the main body of the church, not in a side chapel. Someone must always be present if the Blessed Sacrament is displayed in the monstrance.

Please remember to keep Bishop Kettler and all our priésts, deacons and religious in your prayers.

FORMED PICK OF THE WEEK

The Search-Episode 2 Who are you?

Why am I here? Where did I come from? What happens when I die?

We find the answers to life's big questions when we wrestle with them in our faith. In fact, the story of human history has largely been a story of faith. We need a relationship with our maker-a relationship with life-to make sense of all of this. The Search is a powerful new Catholic evangelization experience hosted by Chris Stefanick and featuring scientists, astronauts, artists and fellow searchers who uncover the answers to life's big questions on happiness, purpose, meaning, and faith.

Every week, Magnifikid offers:


All the readings and the prayers of the Sunday Mass with explanations of the difficult words and the meaning of rituals;
