Pentecost

Jesus' ascension into heaven allows for the Holy Spirit, the Advocated, to come to all of humanity to guide and protect us through trials and decisions until the second coming. On Pentecost Sunday we commemorate the moment that the Holy Spirit descended onto the Apostles which is the beginning of the Church's mission to bring the Good News to the world.

Prayer for the Holy Spirit

Twice during the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest asks the Holy Spirit to intervene. The first time, he holds his hands over the bread and the wine and asks the Holy Spirit to make these offerings become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. A second time, he calls the Spirit upon the congregation so that the people become the Body of Christ. These two prayers are called epiclesis. In Greek, this word means "to call down upon". The one "called down" from heaven is the Holy Spirit. ~us.magnificat.net

Brothers and sisters: No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit. ~ 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13
