Evangelization Corner

Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. I have to admit that the Holy Trinity is an intimidating mystery to explore, but the Catechism reminds us that "the Mystery of the Holy Trinity is the **central mystery** of Christian faith and life." I don't know about you, but that challenges me to pause and at least try to scratch the surface of this great mystery.

Thankfully, Jesus reveals to us the "cliff notes" lesson of the Trinity: God is Love. Love isn't just something God has or does; **it is who He is**. God's very essence is an eternal exchange of love between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. *God has destined us to share in that eternal exchange of love.*

Since God is perfect love, the Trinity models love perfectly poured out and received. It models love that is entirely focused on the other. This means that the mystery of the Trinity has some highly practical applications for our daily life. Since God made us in His image and likeness, we too are called to live in a communion of love with God and one another.

Every community of persons is meant to model the love and unity of the Trinity. Jesus shows us the way by teaching us how to love radically, entirely, and sacrificially. We are called to pour ourselves out in love in our marriages, friendships, parishes, and schools. And we are called to love and affirm the dignity of one another.

The model of love in the Trinity serves as a great way to examine our relationships and communities. Do we live in unity? Where is love ruptured? Where is there division, selfishness, fearful withholding?

Let's call upon the Father, Son and Holy Spirit to strengthen our relationships and expand our capacity to love without reservation.



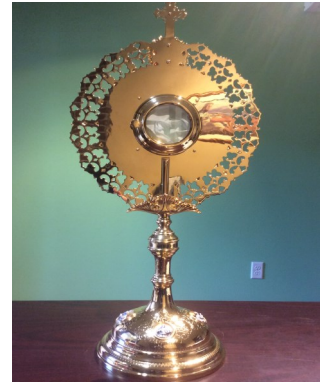

All Cluster-Precautions at Mass
