"Now is the time to consecrate yourself to St. Joseph!

The Church is witnessing an unprecedented era of devotion to St. Joseph... remarkable events have taken place over the past 150 years that show St. Joseph's increasing importance in the life of the Church:

~Donald H. Calloway, MIC/Consecration to St. Joseph.

1868-Blessed Jean-Joseph Lataste, OP, writes a letter to Blessed Pope Pius IX asking him to declare St. Joseph the "Patron of the Universal Church."

1870-Blessed Pope Pius IX declares St. Joseph the "Patron of the Universal Church." St. Joseph is declared the Patron Saint of the Universal Church.

1871-Founding of the Josephites by Cardinal Hebert A. Vaughan

1873-Founding of the Congregation of St. Joseph by St. Leonardo Murialdo.

1878-Founding of the Oblates of St. Joseph by St. Joseph Marello

1879-Apparitions at Knock, Ireland. St. Joseph appears with the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. John the Apostle, and Jesus (appearing as the Lamb of God).

1889-Pope Leo XIII writes *Quamquam Pluries*, and encyclical letter on St. Joseph.

1895-Blessed Petra of St. Joseph begins construction on a shrine to St. Joseph in Barcelona, Spain. It is consecrated in 1901. At her beatification in 1994, St. John Paul II calls Blessed Petra the "apostle of St. Joseph of the 19th century.

1904-Saint Andre Bessette constructs an oratory dedicated to St. Joseph in Montreal Canada. It expands, is declared a minor basilica, and finally is completed in 1967.

1908-St. Luigi Guanella begins constructing a church dedicated to St. Joseph in Rome. It is completed and consecrated as a basilica in 1912.

1909-Pope Pius X officially approves the Litany of St. Joseph.

1914-Saint Luigi Guanella founds the Pious Union of St. Joseph for the Salvation of the Dying.

1917-Apparitions at Fatima, Portugal. During the last apparition on October 13, St. Joseph appears holding the Child Jesus and blessing the world.

1921-Pope Benedict XV inserts the phrase "Blessed be St. Joseph her most chaste spouse" into the Divine Praises.

1947- Spanish Discalced Carmelites found Estudios Josefinos.

1950's-The alleged apparitions of Our Lady of America given to Sr. Mary Ephrem emphasized a renewed devotion to St. Joseph, and St. Joseph himself speaks to the visionary about his devotion.

1955-Veneralble Pope Pius XII establishes the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker (May 1) **1962**-Saint Pope John XXIII inserts St. Joseph's name into the Canon of the Mass.

1989-Saint Pope John Paul II writes *Redemptoris Custos*, an apostolic exhortation on St. Joseph.

2013– Pope Francis, echoing and fulfilling the intentions of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, inserts the name of St. Joseph into all Eucharistic Prayers. He also consecrates Vatican City State to St. Joseph.

2020– Pope Francis decrees a Year of St. Joseph for the Catholic Church (December 8, 2020-December 8, 2021) and writes *Patris Corde*, an apostolic letter on St. Joseph.

Plenary Indulgence Options for the "Year of St. Joseph" + December 8, 2020 through December 8, 2021 +

During this Year of St. Joseph, the Apostolic Penitentiary, which is in charge of indulgences, has established a few ways to receive a Plenary Indulgence:

- 1) Participate in a spiritual retreat for at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph.
- 2) Pray for St. Joseph's intercession for the unemployed so that they might find dignifying work.
- 3) Recite the Litany of St. Joseph for persecuted Christians.
- 4) Entrust one's daily work and activity to the protection of St. Joseph the Worker.
- 5) Follow St. Joseph's example in performing a corporal work of mercy. These include feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, clothing the naked, sheltering the homeless, visiting the imprisoned, visiting the sick, and burying the dead.
- 6) Perform one of the spiritual works of mercy, such as comforting the sorrowful, counseling the doubtful, instructing the ignorant, admonishing the sinner, bearing wrongs patiently, forgiving injuries, and praying for the living and the dead.
- 7) Pray the rosary together with one's family in order that "all Christian families may be stimulated to recreate the same atmosphere of intimate communion, love and prayer that was in the Holy Family." Engaged couples can also receive an indulgence from praying the rosary together.
- 8) Meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Lord's Prayer.
- 9) Recite any legitimately approved prayer to St. Joseph especially on **December 27** (the Solemnity of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph), **March 19** (the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary), on **May 1** (the Memorial of St. Joseph the Worker), on the **19th of each month during the Year**, and on **every Wednesday during the Year**
- 10) Do the Consecration to St. Joseph
 These acts must be accompanied by the three usual conditions:
 sacramental confession, (going to Confession within 20 days
 before or within 20 days after the day the Plenary Indulgence is
 sought), Eucharistic Communion on the day the Plenary
 Indulgence is sought, and prayer for the pope's intentions.




