Evangelization Corner

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us His great gift of peace. St. Paul reminds us in his letter to the Romans that God's gifts are irrevocable and *lasting*. But if this is so, why do we so often feel like Jesus's gift of peace is *fleeting*? On more days than we'd care to admit, our hearts are "troubled" and burdened by worry, haste, and anxiety. We look at our calendars and wonder how we will possibly get everything done. We worry about our marriages, we have aging parents, sick loved ones, and tough decisions to make. Daily we are faced with circumstances that are larger than us.

But gratefully, Jesus does not expect us to surmount life's difficulties by ourselves. That's why He came to save us! Jesus desires to be our rock and security and is delighted when we surrender our burdens to Him. The peace Jesus offers us is not a peace that's contingent upon external circumstances. The peace He gives is sturdier, coming from the confidence that *the unchanging God is always with us*. True peace is found only in Jesus and reliance on Him.

Our trust and childlike dependency upon God is a process that takes time and practice. We can start by simply remembering to ask God for help with our day-to-day needs. When we live like this, our lives become a series of little miracles as we see God's providential care for us in even the smallest of details.

The more we experience God's goodness and care, the more we are able to let go of our self-defeating autonomy and self-sufficiency. We were made for communion, and our human needs creates a wonderful opportunity to receive love. We just need the courage to ask for help. The more we live in childlike dependency and trust in God, the more we will experience the lasting peace that Jesus promises us.

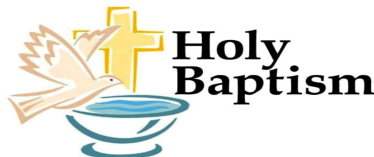

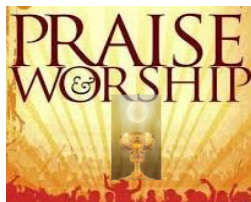
