What is a Valid Catholic Marriage?

- 1. Man & Woman
- 2, Catholic Wedding Ceremony (In the Diocese of St. Cloud)
- 3. Inside a Church
- 4. Celebrated by the Pastor, Bishop, or Deacon in the presence of 2 witnesses
- 5. A celebration (Public)

A <u>Natural marriage</u> or <u>non-Sacramental marriage</u> is any VALID marriage that takes place.

It can be elevated to a <u>Sacramental Marriage</u> only if BOTH husband and wife are Baptized. Baptism is of key importance in sacramental marriage because with it the soul is indelibly marked a belonging to Christ. This is only through God's Grace that is imparted upon them during the ceremony. A Sacramental Marriage can only be dissolved by death or God (the Church through the annulment process.) This means that when a baptized man and a baptized woman exchange marriage vows, they do so as belonging to Christ in a new way, and even their very act of marriage becomes a Christian form of worship of God. The difference between natural and sacramental marriage is not a degree of holiness, but the goal of each kind of marriage. Natural marriage has natural ends, goals which are for the good of life on earth. Sacramental marriage, however, includes all the goals of natural marriage and the purpose of lifting each other to heaven through the special graces that come from belonging to Christ. Building up the Kingdom for God through procreation and unity are of key importance.

A Sacramental marriage can include two baptized non-Catholics marrying in a mainline Christian Church or a Catholic marrying a baptized non-Catholic. With proper dispensation from the Bishop, a Catholic is able to marry a non-Catholic in a non-Catholic Church and have it still be a valid marriage, but again, this requires special permission.

If one of the ingredients of a Valid marriage is not present, the marriage is not valid, which means it is also not Sacramental

An example of an invalid marriage is one that takes place by a <u>Justice of the Peace</u> if one or both are baptized Catholic. The Church sees the couple as choosing to go outside the church norm and choosing their own wants over God's and the Church's hope for them. The Church does not recognize them as husband and wife. Catholics invited to an invalid marriage of a fellow Catholic also have to bear in mind that their attendance can cause scandal. It give the appearance that the couple is correct in their actions. The Catholic who was married by a Justice of the Peace can now not receive the Eucharist until they are back in right relationship with the Church - through confession and a Blessing of their Marriage in the Church.




