Have you thought about how you want to prepare your heart for the coming of Christ during this season?

Here are a few ideas:

*Our parishes have purchased copies of "Waiting for Christ: Meditations for Advent and Christmas" with homily excerpts from St. John Henry Newman. This is a gift from your parish with meditations to pray each day.

Advent Wreath



The use of the wreath and candles during Advent are a longstanding Catholic tradition that was originally adopted by Christians in the Middle Ages as part of their spiritual preparation for Christmas. The wreath and candles are full of symbolism tied to the Christmas season. The wreath itself, which is made of various evergreens, signifies continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God,

the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life we find in Christ. Even the individual evergreens that make up the wreath have their own meanings that can be adapted to our faith. The laurel signifies victory over persecution and suffering. The pine, holly, and yew signify immortality and the cedar signifies strength and healing. The pine cones that decorate the wreath symbolize life and resurrection. The wreath as a whole is meant to remind us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ.

Our Mother Mary

During Advent, we are particularly blessed by the witness of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of Hope. On December 8th we honor her Immaculate Conception, and on December 12th we remember her appearance as Our Lady of Guadalupe, to the young St. Juan Diego in Mexico nearly 500 years ago.

Pope Benedict asked: "Who more than Mary could be a star of hope for us? With her 'yes' she opened the door of our world to God himself; she became the living Ark of the Covenant, in whom God took flesh, became one of us, and pitched his tent among us." In a special way, the Blessed Mother reveals hope to us during the holy season of Advent. Meditating on the joyful mysteries of the rosary, especially in our families, gives us witness to that hope. At the annunciation and visitation, she joyfully expected the Lord. At his birth, he came into the world. At his presentation, and as a child in the temple, he gave a foretaste of the hope that he would give the entire world.

All Saints recently received a check for \$125.00 from the MinisTree Program. Thank you to all those willing to check for volunteer opportunity cards!


