Come to All Saints in Holdingford on March 3rd for Cor Jesu

Cor Jesu is an initiative of the Diocese of Saint Cloud's Eucharistic Revival Team to draw the people of the Diocese to the Eucharistic through an evening of Mass, Adoration, and Reconciliation. Cor Jesu, latin for "Heart of Jesus," is an opportunity to encounter Jesus's merciful love in the Eucharist and meet him face to face. Mass begins at 6:30 p.m. Following the conclusion of Mass there will be Adoration, praise music and at the same time Reconciliation with multiple priests. Prayer: Prayer is conversation with God. It is essential for fasting and almsgiving because prayer gives us the strength to fast. Prayer is the cornerstone of our Lenten journey and is vital to all of our actions in life. **Fasting & Abstinence**: Fasting and abstinence are old traditions in Judeo-Christian history and early Lenten practice. Found in the Scriptures, they offer

The current regulations are as follows: Individuals between the ages of 18 and 59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by having only one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. All over the age of 14 are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays during Lent.

Almsgiving: Almsgiving (giving) is a response to God, one that we can come to through prayer and fasting. It is a way to live out our gratitude for all that God has given us, reflecting the realization that we are the Body of Christ, responsible for each other. https://nolacatholic.org/prayer-fasting-and-almsgiving

Lent - A time to look in the spiritual Mirror



Lent is a time when we as Catholic Christians are called to evaluate our busy lives, our relationship with God, and our habits of faith. A part of this selfevaluation is to get honest with ourselves, and God, about the sincerity in

which we: say our prayers, fast, or give of our money, time, and talent. Lent is a time to take a good look in the spiritual mirror and make changes according to what we see reflecting back at us. Sometimes we forget that God sees the true intentions of our heart, we think we are hiding, but we are not.

COVERED EYES

One of my daughters, when she was a young child, gave me a good laugh one day. She and the other children asked me to play hide and seek. The youngest stood in the middle of the room, covered her eyes with her hands, and said, "come and find me". At first I thought she was kidding, but I soon realized she really thought that if she could not see me, I could not see her.

We are children of God. Could it be that at times we are like my youngest daughter, hiding from God in many ways? Sometimes we cover our spiritual eyes and our hearts by shutting God out when we sin, by a lack of practicing holy disciplines, pride, etc. This Lent, let us open our eyes and our hearts to God like never before. Let us focus not only on what we are "doing" for Lent, but also the one who we are doing it for. Let us stop hiding from God, and open our eyes to the possibility of a deeper relationship with our Father in heaven.


Rural Catholic Middle Age Singles Group


