

Servant of God Michelle Christine Duppong



Duppong understood that sanctity is not for the few, the elite or the cloistered. "You were made to be a saint. Do you

believe that? Do you think you can do it? ... sometimes I think we can get caught up in thinking that holiness is imitating everything the saints did, and we forget that God is calling each of us to follow Him and carry out the mission He gives us in a unique way." Michelle wrote this in a column for the Bismarck Diocese in March 2015 after her diagnosis with cancer. Michelle grew up in a rural town of Haymarsh, North Dakota, attended North Dakota State University for college, and died in 2015 at the age of 31 after an arduous battle with colon cancer. On November 1, 2022, Bishop Kagan of the Diocese of Bismarck announced that the Vatican has declared her Servant of God and is investigating her Cause for Canonization. Bishop Kagan encourages us to privately ask for Michelle's intercession and has said that "you will not be disappointed." Any special favors that are granted should be reported to
