How does Martha's Meals work?

When we are informed of a family who would like to receive a meal, we establish days and times that would be most convenient for the family to receive meals, any food allergies/aversions, and any favorite meals. Once those days are established, (typically 5 meals over the course of 3 weeks) a message goes out to all the volunteers in our parishes and volunteers sign up for which days/times work for them and say what they plan on making the family. When the scheduled day and time comes, the volunteer drops the meal off (in containers that do not need to be returned,) and is on their way back home!

What do those who have received meals have to say about it?

*I can't even put into words how thankful we were for the Martha's Meals program! It provided us with relief from the stress and burden of trying to find time to make a meal. We were thankful to be able to take the time to focus on our little ones and soak in those extra snuggles instead of worrying about a meal!

*We are so grateful for Martha's Meals and the wonderful food we received! It was so nice to have a delicious meal (that I didn't have to cook!) especially after my husband returned to work after our daughter was born.

*To have a meal dropped off helped us take the night off from cooking and gave us the opportunity to relax and reconnect as a family which can be difficult to do when having a newborn. The meals also made us feel loved and supported by our community!



Why do priests kiss the altar at the start of Mass?

One of the ways that we recognize the importance of the altar is when the priest and deacon kiss the altar at the beginning of Mass. This is an ancient act of devotion.

Remember, we also kiss the cross on Good Friday, and the deacon or priest kisses the "Book of the Gospels" after the Gospel is proclaimed. This act of devotion reminds us that the altar is a symbol of Jesus, the "living stone" (1 Peter 2:4), the foundation stone of our faith. It is a symbol gesture, but it is a powerful reminder of the One on whom our faith is built and in whose name we gather as the "household of faith" (Galatians 6:10).
