The Story of Fatima

A message of peace. A call to prayer.

Do you remember, back in June, when we celebrated, at our weekend Masses, devotion and consecration to the <u>Immaculate</u> <u>Heart of Mary</u> and the <u>Sacred Heart of Jesus</u>? We did the consecration blessing and prayers together, but <u>do you know how to continue this devotion</u>? <u>Where did it come from?</u>

Regarding devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, one of the most important aspects of the Fatima message was Our Lady's request for the <u>First Saturday devotion</u>. In the July 13, 1917 apparition at Fatima, Our Lady said to the children (the three she was appearing to), "You have seen hell where the souls of poor sinners go. To save them, God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart...I shall come to ask for the Communion of Reparation on the first Saturdays." Years later, she came expressly with the request for this devotion when she appeared to Sister Lucia, (one of the three children Mary appeared to in Fatima), where she was preparing for religious life.

At the height of World War I, Pope Benedict XV appealed to the Blessed Mother to intercede for peace. Just over a week later, Our Lady began appearing to three young shepherd children in Fatima Portugal. From May 13 – October 13, 1917, Our Lady appeared to Lucia dos Santos and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto – three shepherd children tending sheep in the hills just outside their small village of Fatima, Portugal.

At the final apparition, October 13, as promised, Our Lady performed a great miracle for "all to believe." The unexplainable solar phenomena occurred before 70,000 people gathered at the Cova da Iria that day, and was witnessed from 25 miles away. Only twice in the world's history has the exact date, time and location of a miracle been predicted: At the Resurrection and at Our Lady of Fatima's Miracle of the Sun.



Five Requirements for the First Saturday Devotion

- *Go to Confession 8 days before or after First Saturday.
- *Receive Holy Communion which can be at a Saturday evening anticipatory Mass.
- *Pray 5 decades of the Rosary.
- *Keep Our Lady company. Do this for 15 minutes while meditating on one or more of the mysteries of the Rosary.

The Five Blasphemies

- *Against the Immaculate Conception
- *Against her Perpetual Virginity
- *Against her Divine Maternity, while refusing to receive her as the Mother of Mankind
- *For those who try to implant in the hearts of children indifference, disrespect and hate against the Immaculate Mother
- *By those who insult her directly in her Sacred Images


What are the promises to those who faithfully practice this devotion?

- *Salvation of their souls
- *Salvation of others souls
- *Peace in the world

Once you have completed five consecutive First Saturdays, continue to practice the devotion monthly for the sake of obtaining graces for the salvation of other souls.
