THE FIVE PROPERTIES OF RESURRECTED BODIES*

"Christ's Resurrection was not a return to earthly life...Christ's Resurrection is essentially different. In his risen body he passes from the state of death to another life beyond time and space. At Jesus' Resurrection his body is filled with the power of the Holy Spirit: he shares the divine life in his glorious state, so that St. Paul can say that Christ is 'the man of heaven'"

SCRIPTURE PROPERTY SUMMARY

IMMORTAL The body will not die again. Eternal life is not just the survival of the spirit in a spiritual realm but the glorification of the entire soul, body & spirit together, in the new heaven and new earth.

LUCID (CLARITY, LIGHTSOME, GLORIOUS)

The body will be beautiful, perfect, and radiant, reflecting the interior beauty of the spirit perfected in grace. As the moon reflects the glory of the Sun, the blessed will, restored in Christ's image & likeness, reflect the glory of the Son.

SPIRITUAL (SUBTLETY)

The body will be in accordance with a rightly ordered intellect & will (integrity) instead of being dominated by passions. This is not suppression of desire, rather the perfect harmony between man's body & his principle form (spirit), in communion with God's will.

IMPASSIBLE

The body will not suffer from disorder, pain, or illness. Evil will have no place in the soul. The mind will still gain knowledge & pleasure through sensory experience but with ease.

AGILE (POWER) The body will be physical but not be bound by time and space. It will be quick to carry out what the spirit desires without difficulty or labor.

Dying he destroyed our death, rising he restored our life.

These are the words of one of the Memorial Acclamations choices we proclaim at Mass, and it really sums up Holy Week in one short sentence. The Sacrifice of the Mass, the Eucharist, is the "source and summit" of our faith. Why? Because in it we receive a share in the Divinity of Jesus Christ. And what exactly is His Divinity? It is that part of God that makes Him God, it is the "saving grace", which we must have to get to heaven.

There are two main focuses of the Eucharistic Revival: to renew awareness that through Sacrifice of the Mass Jesus becomes truly present: body, blood, soul, and divinity, and to encourage us to a revival of our faith, individually and as a Church.

Jesus became one of us. Jesus had a body; we have a body. Jesus veins were filled with human blood; we have blood. Jesus had a soul; we have a soul, but we are missing one thing, His divinity! In all the Sacraments, we receive this divine grace, a share in His divinity. God gave us His only son and He died to destroy our death and He rose to restore our life. Because of all He did for us and gave us in His Church, we have the Hope of the Resurrection to eternal life. Thank you, Jesus!!!! Happy Easter everyone!

What Would Mary Do?

This Easter morning, I am thinking of Mary Magdalene.

I want to know her state of mind as she approached the tomb in the darkness. Was she afraid? Was she thinking clearly? Was she tired? Had grief and trauma robbed her of her sleep the last two nights? What did she intend to do? Anoint Christ's body, yes — but what else? Kiss his hands, trace the markings where the lash had fallen upon his skin? Say goodbye? Weep? Despair? What were the words she planned to whisper into the cold, empty darkness that morning, as she wept over God's body?

But everything and everyone had fallen apart around her, and in Jesus' presence she knew her heart would be able to rest.

If you have ever been in the midst of a crisis in your life and found yourself pacing the floors of your house when no one else is awake, muttering the words to a prayer you know by heart, you know what Mary Magdalene felt. In those moments, we do not always feel God's presence. Sometimes, when we look for Him, we only see an empty tomb.

When these dark moments come, remember the faithfulness of this great saint. Be like Mary Magdalene. Look for Jesus, always. You may not always find him, but he will always find you.


