NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

In my ministry experience as a Deacon, being ordained in 2017, the one lament I hear, by far more than any other, is regarding loved ones that have drifted away from their Catholic faith. As I was looking at the National Eucharistic Revival's website (eucharisticrevival.org) I was reminded that this revival in the Diocese of the United States is not something we are doing; it is the work of the Holy Spirit. When we look just at our own families, and extended families, we don't have to look long to figure out that our Church needs a renewal of faith.

So, what do we do about it?

First, we don't despair and recall that we are to trust in the Lord.

"My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth" (Psalm 121:2)

Secondly, realize that while Jesus desires our cooperation to be His mouth, hands, and feet, in this renewal of the Church, the actual conversion and transformation of souls is a work of the Holy Spirit.

When I was attending formation to become a deacon, my spiritual director Father Tony told me that in the future, when I preach, know that your carefully chosen words of your homily will touch at least 2 or 3 people at the Mass. What? That's it? After all that work? Then he said something I will never forget. *"Dan, always remember that it is the Holy Spirit that will touch the hearts of many who hear your homilies, you are not doing this on your own".*

So don't give up on our loved ones who are astray. Keep praying! Trust God! The Holy Spirit is going to change our country through this revival. Peace in Christ, Deacon Dan

New Cemetery Guidelines will take effect **July 1st, 2024**. For a complete list of Cemetery Guidelines, please contact the Parish Office.

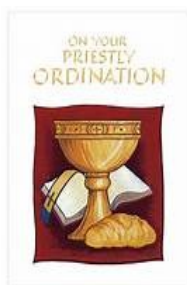
1. All flowers and objects not glued or cemented to the monuments need to be removed by October 1st. Anything left will be removed. 2. Nothing is allowed on the grass. Decorations are only allowed on the cement ribbon or attached to the monument. 3. No grave will be opened until payment is made in full. 4. Prices will be increasing to \$300 perpetual care for parishioners. For non-parishioners, prices will increase to \$300 perpetual care and \$1200 for the plot. 5. No alcohol or intoxicated persons are to be on cemetery property or in attendance at a graveside service. No beer or alcohol memorabilia left on the grave for decoration is allowed. 6. One ground burial and one cremation may be on the same grave, except when their child dies, then three urns may be purchased on one grave plot. The burial must come first and cremated remains second. Cremation burials on top of a previous ground burial are required to have an urn or vault no larger than 8" high to allow for 12-14" of topsoil. 7. For two burials on the same plot a monument of the dimensions for a single grave will be allowed on the cement ribbons provided. If a separate marker is desired for the second burial, a lawn level marker is allowed on the grass in front of the ribbon (this is not allowed in St. Columbkille). It must be flush to the ground to allow the lawnmower to drive over the top. 8. Pets must be on a leash and must be cleaned up after.

The end of the fiscal year is June 30th. All receipts are due to the Office by 10:00 a.m. on June 19th in order to be reimbursed.

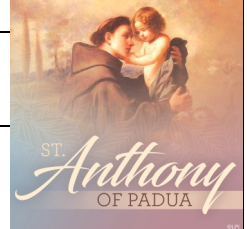
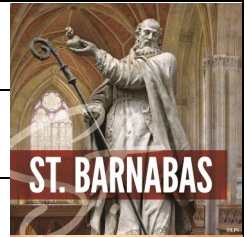

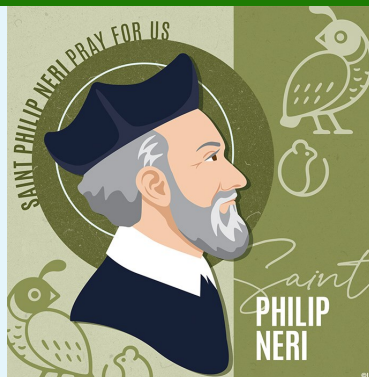
