Baptism: Call the Central Office to schedule Baptism.



Saint Gregory the Great's Story



Ordained a priest, Gregory became one of the pope's seven deacons, and also served six years in the East as papal representative in Constantinople. He was recalled to become abbot, but at the age of 50 was elected pope by the clergy and people of Rome.

Gregory was direct and firm. He removed unworthy priests from office, forbade taking money for many services, emptied the papal treasury to ransom prisoners of the Lombards and to care for persecuted Jews and the victims of plague and famine. He was very concerned about the conversion

of England, sending 40 monks from his own monastery. He is known for his reform of the liturgy, and for strengthening respect for doctrine. Whether he was largely responsible for the revision of "Gregorian" chant is disputed.

Gregory relied heavily on the Holy Spirit, as you can see by the dove depicted in the picture above.

His book, *Pastoral Care*, on the duties and qualities of a bishop, was read for centuries after his death. He described bishops mainly as physicians whose main duties were preaching and the enforcement of discipline. In his own down-to-earth preaching, Gregory was skilled at applying the daily Gospel to the needs of his listeners. Called "the Great," Gregory has been given a place with Augustine, Ambrose, and Jerome, as one of the four key doctors of the Western Church. "Franciscan media

The Year of Mission

For a very long time people believed simply because they belonged, and so they came to the Church with minimal evangelistic effort; it no longer works that way. Like in the times of the Apos-

tles, where only a few initially belonged to the emerging Church, the Apostles had to be missionary, to go out to the people where they were at. So today, like in the times of the Apostles, we must go to them, thus the "Year of Mission".

The Eucharistic Congress is over, and it is time to accomplish the next step.

I am forming a core team, details forthcoming, to discern how we can best encourage and foster missionary discipleship in our faith community. ** Please pray about becoming a member and contact me with questions. The approach of this core team will be one based on prayer and discernment, building each other up first, then what we "do" will come second. All of this is wrapped in the inspiration of the Eucharistic Revival. Below, Pope Francis expresses, in 2023, what his hopes and concerns would be post-Eucharistic Congress, which is now.

Pope Francis To the organizing committee of the National **Eucharistic Congress, June 19, 2023**

"It is my hope, then, that the Eucharistic Congress will inspire Catholics throughout the country to discover anew the sense of wonder and awe at the Lord's great gift of himself and to spend time with him in the celebration of the Holy Mass and in personal prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. I believe that we have lost the sense of adoration in our day. We must rediscover the sense of adoration in silence. It is a form of prayer that we have lost."
