# New Evangelization Corner ~Deacon Dan Dullinger





In this the "Year of Mission" for the Eucharistic Revival, the national team suggest four areas (pillars) to focus on to accomplish the mission; the mission is an important one because souls are at stake. These four focus areas have one goal in mind, to help ourselves, and then others, encounter our Eucharistic Lord like never before. The model here is very much like the Apostles, first Jesus built them up, then sent them out do the same for others. In the coming weeks I will post these four pillars one at a time.

#### PILLAR 1—Eucharistic Encounter

In order to lead people to a relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist, we have to maintain an active relationship with him ourselves. This pillar focuses on deepening that personal relationship through prayer, adoration, and the sacraments. Regular, profound encounters with Jesus strengthen us to be a more authentic and powerful witness to his love.

I encourage you to pray about which of these areas the Lord is calling you closer!
