Epiphany means "manifestation," or public display. The feast is usually celebrated January 6th. In the US, it is celebrated on the Sunday nearest to January 6th. It originates from a story unique to Matthew (2:1-12). Magi from the East come to offer homage to the newborn King, presenting him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

This part of Matthew's infancy narrative differs from Luke's account of the birth of Jesus. In Luke there are no Magi, star, nor gifts. Luke has Jesus being born in a stable after Mary and Joseph's long travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Matthew seems to have the family living in a house in Bethlehem, where the Magi find them.

Why these differences? They stem from the needs and concerns of the audience the authors were addressing, as well as the theological stance of each author. Knowing the original intention helps get at the correct interpretation of the text.

Since Matthew was writing primarily to a Jewish community, his concern was to show that Jesus did not come just for Jews, but for Gentiles as well. From his very birth, Jesus not only manifests himself to Jews, but also to Gentiles, who are prominently included in the manifestation, symbolized by the Magi and their journey. This is the most significant aspect of the feast of Epiphany. How do you manifest Jesus to all with whom you come into contact?

Epiphany Blessing

The Epiphany household blessing is a centuries-old tradition that invokes God's blessing on all who enter one's home. All you need for an Epiphany blessing is chalk, which is usually made available by parishes either on the feast of the Epiphany or in the weeks leading up to it. There are a few different formulas for blessings out there, but the essence of the ritual is always the same: a priest or the head of the household calls down God's blessing on the house and everyone who comes into it, and an inscription is made above the door in chalk. The inscription reads: the first two digits of the year + C + M + B + the last two digits of the year. The initials C, M and B represent the names of the magi — Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar — and also signify the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat:* "May Christ bless the house."

The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah_of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. (Catechism #528)

Maybe each year on the Epiphany some of us ask... "What were those three things again? Perhaps it is not as important to remember the official list as it to review how the Epiphany story "manifests" itself in our spiritual lives and obligations.

Ask yourself these questions: Am I, like the Wisemen, adoring Jesus, giving Jesus gifts of my time, talent, and treasure? The Wisemen had to take a different route home to avoid King Herod, am I taking a different route, as to avoid worldly living? Jesus was baptized, am I living out my baptismal call to evangelize, to make Him known so others can have the epiphany that this world is not the end? At the wedding feast, Jesus turned the water into wine, am I allowing Jesus to transform me? I hope and pray you enjoyed a blessed and peace filled 12 days of Christmas. (Deacon Dan)

Rural Catholic Middle Ages Singles Group: Jan. 11th



The Holy Name of Jesus A Name Reverenced by All

St Paul tells us in his Letter to the Philippians, "at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth" (2:10). The name of Jesus was first spoken by an angel and is the cause of adoration by the heavenly court. It is a name reverenced especially during the Mass, as the General Instruction of the Roman Missal instructs the priest to bow his head at the mention of Jesus' name. It is a name that evil fears, and when invoked can cast out demons. We honor and celebrate the name of Jesus because the name of God deserves reverence.

It is the Name by Which We Are Saved

The angel tells St. Joseph to name the child Jesus because he will save us from our sins (Mt 1:21). By His incarnation, God made man takes on a name indicating he comes to save us. 
All Saints Building Committee
