It's not yet Christmas... How can we make final preparations?

1. Clean the stable of your heart

a good sacramental confession sweeps out the dirt of sin and makes us clean.

2. Seek silence

When we have moments of silence it is then that God's Holy Spirit can speak to us, give us certain lights or insights, and send heavenly inspirations.

3. More frequent and fervent prayer

Saint Paul states that we should pray constantly and give thanks to God in our hearts. Jesus also said that it is necessary to pray always without giving up hope. (Lk. 18:1) Set aside more time to talk to the Lord, Mary, and Saint Joseph in the depths of your heart.

4. Find joy in giving more than having

Let us seek out ways that we can give to others, especially those most in need. Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta asserted: *Give until it hurts!*

5. Attend Holy Mass

In a real sense, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is a *daily Christmas*. How, you might ask? Very simply: the priest consecrates the Host which is transformed into Jesus. He is really born in the hands of the priest. Then, when you approach to receive Holy Communion with a pure and loving heart, Jesus is born in your heart. Your soul becomes a real *Bethlehem—House of Bread*.

6. Reconcile

The great English poet Alexander Pope wrote: *To err is human, to forgive is divine*. Christmas is not a time in which we should be at enmity with others, especially members of our own family. Two of the most difficult but important phrases that should issue from our hearts and lips are: *I am sorry... and... I forgive you!!!* If you are angry, resentful, bitter, and even hateful towards anybody, now is the time to reconcile. Be humble! Take the initiative and reconcile.

7. Mother Mary & Christmas

Of course, Christmas would not have taken place if it were not for the generous *yes of Mary!* Stay close to Mary. Pray the Rosary, especially the Joyful Mysteries. Accompany Mary in her journey to Bethlehem. Be with her in the stable as she brings forth Jesus for your salvation.

Is the "Hail Mary" prayer biblical? If you recall our Gospel today, this the 4th week of Advent, you may have noticed some familiar words from one of the most common of Catholic prayers, the "Hail Mary", and it is indeed very biblical. In the Gospel of Luke, within, and just before, this week's Gospel verses, we have the following quotes:

Prayer: Hail Mary full of grace the Lord is with you. [The Angel Gabriel] And he came to her [Mary] and said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" (Luke 1:28).

Prayer: Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus."

...and she [Elizabeth, the Baptists mother] exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! (Luke 1:42)

Prayer: Holy Mary, Mother of God...

"And why is this granted me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? (Luke 1:43).

Prayer: Pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

** All but the last line of the prayer is right out of Luke's Gospel, and this line comes from the tradition of our Catholic faith.

Perhaps as we approach Christmas this week, get out your bible, read and pray with this portion of Lukes Gospel as a family. Give Mary the gift of your devotion for she has so much she wants to give you. What you give will also be a gift to you, a gift that keeps on giving for all eternity. Thank you, Mary, for by your "yes" to God's Will, the Savior of the World was born.




Do you believe in the power of prayer?

Jubilee 2025: Pilgrims of Hope

The coming Jubilee proclaimed by Pope Francis will be a



Holy Year marked by the hope that does not fade; our hope in God. The jubilee will begin in Rome on the vigil of the Lord's Nativity on Dec. 24, 2024 with the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica, and in local dioceses (St. Mary's Cathedral, St. Cloud) on Holy Family Sunday on Dec. 29. It will conclude in local dioceses the following Holy Family Sunday on Dec. 28, 2025, and in Rome on the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, Jan. 6, 2026, with the closing of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica.

What is a Jubilee Year

*A Holy Year of the forgiveness of sin, conversion and joyful celebration.

*The word "jubilee" comes from the Hebrew word yobel, which refers to the ram's horn used to announce a jubilee in the Old Testament:

This fiftieth year you shall make sacred by proclaiming liberty in the land for all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you, when every one of you shall return to his own property, every one to his own family estate. (Lev. 25:10)

Jubilee Indulgence: Special graces for the forgiveness of sins are made available during the Jubilee Year. The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence – remission of all temporal punishment (time in Purgatory) for sin– by meeting the normal conditions (confession, Holy Communion, prayer for the pope's intentions, and no attachment to sin) and by participating in one of the following activities: Pilgrimages visits to sacred places, works of mercy, and penance.
