The New "Holy Communion Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery Outside the Mass: book of orders and rites.

There are several ways the Catholic Church provides "Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery Outside of Mass" (HCWEMOMO), and some of these rites and orders have new adaptions. The new book containing all of this, reminds us that the "Eucharist in the Sacrifice of the Mass is truly the origin and purpose of the worship that is shown to the Eucharist outside of Mass".

"The reason for which the Church reserves the Eucharist outside Mass is, primarily, the administration of Viaticum to the dying and, secondarily, Communion of the sick, Communion outside Mass [Word and Communion Services], and adoration of Christ present in the sacrament" (Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside Mass, no. 5).

So how does this affect our parishes?

Word and Communion Services (multiple variations in the new book) Since we have a resident Priest, and multiple regularly scheduled Masses, this doesn't really affect us.

Rite of Communion to the Sick / Homebound

Scripted new rites for homebound ministers will be available soon. If you ever bring communion to the homebound or a sick family member or friend, please see the bottom of the second page for further instructions.

(Adoration) Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction

The goal of the new adaptations is to harmonize the book with existing customs for Eucharistic Adoration in this country, (see details below).

*A rubric has been added to officially permit the priest or deacon to wear a white cope for Exposition. A white cope, for Priest or Deacon, is required for Benediction. *During Benediction, there is no longer the presider's invocation, "You have given them bread from heaven", and the adorer's response, "Having all sweetness...", but rather just the prayer by the presider.

*Some things we do customarily, like the <u>divine praises</u>, the <u>classic hymns</u>, are now officially written in the order of exposition and benediction.

In case you didn't notice; the 3-Year Eucharistic Revival, these new rites and orders and our parish's Eucharistic Consecration event, all draw us to focus on the Eucharistic Lord. Why? There is a call by the Holy Spirit to once again restore awareness of the strengthening, the Healing Power, and necessity, of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The Eucharist, if we cooperate with the grace given, literally makes us holy before the Father, that's why Jesus said you must eat my Body and drink my Blood to go to heaven. The Eucharist transforms our lives so that we become like that which we eat, Jesus. ~God bless you all, Deacon Dan

33 Days to Eucharistic Glory – We made it!

It was wonderful be worship with you this weekend! I don't have a lot of opportunities to be here on weekends, but I always look forward to it when I do. This is an amazing community of faithful people!

For those who participated in "33 Days to Eucharistic Glory" preparation for consecrating yourselves to our Eucharistic Lord, this weekend's consecration is not the end but rather the beginning of a new journey.

We are all on a journey of faith and there are times and circumstances along the way where the Lord invites us deeper, and this consecration preparation, ending with the prayer of consecration to the Eucharist, was one of those opportunities. As we go forward post-consecration, recall that it is not we who orchestrate transformation in our lives, but rather it is God's grace. When we cooperate with that grace, transformation of our mind, heart, and soul takes place. I could share a lot from the preparation book in the form of quotes and meditations, but below, from the heart, is what I took away.

Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, and that is the source and summit of our faith, but there is more to this consecration than that. Every human being must make a firm decision to turn to God. Making a "decision" for God, saying our prayers and attending Mass are a step, but the next level in the spiritual life takes us from a decision to a disposition. One definition of the word disposition is "the way in which something is placed or arranged, especially in relation to other things". The invitation to Eucharistic Consecration was just that, making God that "way", that "something" placed and arranged above all else.

I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me (Galatians 2:20)

I can assure you that God is pouring His powerful graces upon you, and you will never be the same as you were 33 days ago. If you missed out, buy the book (33 Days to Eucharistic Glory) and start your journey! Peace in Christ, Deacon Dan




