# New Evangelization Corner

In this Gospel scene from today, Jesus, now Baptized and filled with Holy Spirit, starts His Public Ministry by reading the Law and the Prophets and giving a very short but powerful homily. Jesus in essence said, I am the one Isaiah spoke about, I have come to set you free.

#### What do you need to be freed from?

Notice Jesus did not say, I have come to shame and blame, nor have I come to condemn you. Jesus came to set us free from something we can't, sin and all its effects; it is an affliction we all are born with. Perhaps we feel like those in Ezra and Nehemiah's time, as they heard the scriptures, realizing their failure. But they were told don't weep, rejoice, He is giving us another chance.

In their Jewish tradition, in a Jubilee year (every 50 years), people were relieved of all their debt, slaves were released, and land taken away was given back. So, it is significant that Jesus continued quoting Isaiah when he said he came to "proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord" Ah yes, Jesus was proclaiming a new Jubilee, a forever freedom in Him. In this He was offering those same three gifts: to forgive our debt of sin, free us from the slavery caused by sin, and give us our land back, the promised land (heaven). Only through Jesus Christ can we be set free.

Wouldn't it be nice to pick one hardship in our life and have Jesus free us of it?

What we need to be freed from, more than any worldly hardship, is sin. Why? Because the effects of it steal our inner peace, or if serious sin, cuts us off from God's saving grace.

# Jesus did His part, what can we do for our part?

Obedience is a powerful act of love that aligns our hearts with God's will, but it requires the grace to overcome sin, selfishness, and pride. When we fully surrender to God, like the servants at the wedding feast of Cana, blessings will flow; we will be set free from any oppression, spiritual blindness, or spiritual difficulties.

Jesus set us free, and He continues to do so through the Ministry of the Church, the Mass and Eucharist, and in the Sacraments of Healing, which are Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. Whatever is oppressing you, blinding you from seeing the truth, or keeping you from God, turn to Jesus, who has come to set you free.

St. Thomas Aguinas –Feast day: January 28 One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 – 1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, at age 21 he traveled to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great to become a Dominican priest.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the



whole of Catholic theology. The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aguinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today. St. Thomas, pray for us!

# **Life Awareness Retreat**

On Feb. 8th, the religious communities in the St. Cloud Diocese are hosting a Life Awareness Retreat for people ages 18 through 30 to help them discern the next steps God is asking of them.

Benedictine Sister Laura Suhr, assistant vocations director for the Sisters of the Order of St. Benedict in St. Joseph, said, "Discernment is a huge piece of what young people deal with — they face so many life choices and often don't know how to make those decisions. So our religious communities are collaborating to offer a one-day opportunity to see where God might be calling them."

The Life Awareness Retreat includes the Franciscan Sisters of Little Falls, the Crosier Fathers and Brothers, the Benedictine monks of St. John's Abbey and the Maryknoll Missioners, in addition to the Sisters of St. Benedict. This is their first collaborative discernment retreat.




