New Evangelization Corner

The Immaculate Heart of Mary

Across August, we revere the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and this was at the center of the messages of Our Lady of Fatima in 1917, the most extraordinary supernatural event since the Resurrection. She spoke of it repeatedly, and with the June 13th apparition, Our Lady showed her Immaculate Heart in the palm of her hand to Lucia, Jancinta, and Francisco. When she said to the children, in the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph, all of us received one of the most important promises to ever come from Heaven.

And 100 years ago on December 10th, Our Lady appeared again to Lucia at a convent in Pontevedra Spain with the child Jesus who said Have compassion on the Heart of your most Holy Mother, covered with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce It at every moment, and there is no one to make an act of reparation to remove them. Three months later, Jesus appeared to her again with an urgent request to promote the Five First Saturday Devotion, and Lucia did what she was told for the rest of her long life on earth.

We helped atone for the five grievous offenses against the Immaculate Heart of Mary: blasphemies against her Immaculate Conception, Perpetual Virginity, Divine Maternity, insults against her Holy Image, and the stirring of indifference, scorn, and even hatred in children.

Seek them out, the way our Blessed Mother is endlessly seeking us out and striving to lead our human hearts to the Sacred Heart of her Son our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, ~Jeff Johnson


Night Prayer

What are the different kinds of prayer?


I prayed for something and God didn't grant it. Why? Doesn't the Bible condemn repetitious prayers like the rosary?

Nicene Creed

We all mark time with anniversaries and birthdays, and of course this is especially true of our great Catholic Church. 1700 years ago, this past June in the year 325, Emperor Constantine summoned many Catholic Bishops to assemble in Nicaea to clarify the totality of our beliefs with a single prayer. This was a turbulent time in the early Church because many heresies were flourishing, most notably Arianism which argued that Christ was not divine. Blessed by the Holy Spirit, those bishops led by Eusebius of Caesarea wrote the first version of the Nicene Creed which Catholics pray at every Mass, and it really is a wonderful summary of everything we believe! While we pray for their conversion to the one true Church of Christ, it is a comfort to know that many Christian denominations pray it right along with us at their services.
