New Evangelization Corner Doug Herbek



Saint Teresa of Avila Feast Day: October 15 Patron Saint of headache sufferers and those ridiculed for their religious faith. Pray for us!

We shall never learn to know ourselves except by endeavoring to know God; for ,beholding his greatness, we realize our own littleness"

- 1. Saint Teresa of Avila was born in Spain in 1515.
- 2. She was a Carmelite nun and a mystic, authoring poetry as well as spiritual classics including "The Interior Castle", "The Way of Perfection", and her autobiography.
- 3. Since she was concerned about lax spiritual practices, she and her friend Saint John of the Cross, a Carmelite friar, reformed Carmelite monasteries despite intense opposition. Together, they founded the Discalced Carmelites, a more austere congregation of nuns and friars.
- 4. She suffered from numerous health issues, including epilepsy, seizures, and migraines.
- 5. She died in 1582, and was canonized in 1622. Her body remains incorrupt (not decomposed) even though she died over 400 years ago!
- 6. In 1970, Pope Paul declared her a Doctor of the Church. She was the first woman to be named as a Doctor of the Church.



St. Hedwig was a wife and mother married to the Duke of Silesia (now Poland) at the end of the 12th century.

She used her wealth and power to help establish monasteries, build hospitals, and promote peace. She spent her final years living in a monastery in Trebnitz participating in their religious exercises and died in 1243.

October is Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month.

What can Saints Teach us About Child Loss?

The Martin's Experience Of Loss Through looking at the stories of the lives of the saints we can be renewed in hope. They remind us that it is in our suffering that we are being made holy, purified and drawn closer to Christ if we allow ourselves to be. Saints Louis and Zelie Martin, the parents of St. Therese of Lisieux buried four of their children, over a four year period. After hearing of her brother's loss of his only son, who was stillborn St. Zelie wrote a letter of encouragement to him. With words of sympathy and consolation for her

brother, she reminded him that his baby was now at the side of God. She expressed the pain she felt burying her own children, but also the promise of eternal life and the joy of seeing her children again in heaven.

Chiara Corbella's Experience Servant of God Chiara Corbella, who died in 2012 at the young age of 28 experienced much suffering in her short years as a wife and motherHer first baby Maria, died thirty minutes after birth due to anencephaly. After the passing of Maria, Chiara stated, "The day of Maria's birth I shall recall as one of the most beautiful days of my life, I shall tell all of my children they have a special sister who is praying for them in heaven." Several months later, Chiara became pregnant with her second child. When they heard the news at their ultrasound that their second child was missing a leg and part of an arm they asked God, "Where are you taking us?" Not known to Chiara at the time, she would be diagnosed with cancer during her third pregnancy, which claimed her life a year after she gave birth to her son Francesco.

Although the saints did not always understand why they were going through such grief and heartache, they looked to Christ and kept their eves fixed on the Cross of Jesus. They held onto the hope of eternal life and the promise of seeing their babies again someday in heaven. Even in the difficulties and pain, they clung to their faith. When they did not know where God was leading them or why he would allow them to endure such pain and suffering, they trusted. Knowing the love of God never leaves us at the Cross, but will always bring us to the glory of the Resurrection.

Our sixth prayer challenge intention: For Architect, Contractor, liturgical consultant, and laborers.


