New Evangelization Corner Doug Herbek

"The more ready you are to give yourself to God and to others, the more you discover the authentic meaning of life." Saint Pope John Paul II

- 1. Saint Pope John Paul II was born as Karol Wojtyla on May 18, 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. His mother died before he was 10.
- 2. In 1942, he began his studies for the priesthood in the seminary of Krakow, which was clandestine because of the Nazi occupation of Poland. During this period, he was also one of the organizers of the "underground" Rhapsodic Theatre, which performed in private due to Nazi repression.
- 3. His 1979 pilgrimage to his homeland, Poland, has been described as the turning point in a gradual revolution that eventually led to the fall of Communism in the former Soviet Union.
- 4. On May 13, 1981, he was shot but not killed. On May 13 earlier in history: Saint Therese of Lisieux was cured of a mysterious illness after looking at a statue of Our Blessed Mother on May 13, 1883; Our Blessed Mother appeared in Fatima on May 13, 1917.
- 5. Although he wrote an extraordinary number of encyclicals and homilies, he was also an avid skier, a soccer player, and a poet.
- 6. Saint Pope John Paul II died in 2005. He had been the first non-Italian pope in over 450 years.
