New Evangelization Corner Doug Herbek



Saint Andrew Düng-Lạc and his companions
Feast Day: November 24

Patron saint of: Vietnam Saint Andrew Düng-Lac, Pray for us!

Martyrdom means precisely witness. Every Christian without exception is called to this by living his daily life in holiness, ever ready 'to account for the hope' that is in him.

- Saint Pope John Paul II

1. This feast day is named for Andrew Dũng-Lạc, a priest, but celebrated together on this feast day are a total of 117 of the faithful. They were bishops, priests, and laypeople who gave their lives for Christ in the 1600s, 1700s, and 1800s. Ninety-six were native Vietnamese, and 21 were Spanish or French missionaries to Vietnam. This group of 117, canonized together by Pope John Paul II in 1988, in turn stands for a nameless multitude estimated at between 100,000 and 300,000 martyrs of Vietnam.

2. Around the year 1795, Andrew Dũng-Lạc was born as Dũng An-Tran in an impoverished family in northern Vietnam. When he was at least 12, he met a Christian catechist; subsequently he was baptized with the name Andrew.

3. In 1823, Andrew was ordained a priest. His preaching and

simplicity led many to be baptized.

4. In 1832, the Emperor Minh-Mang banned foreign missionaries and commanded Vietnamese Christians to trample on crucifixes (dramatized in the film "Silence," an adaptation of the novel of the same name by Shūsaku Endō) to renounce their faith in Jesus Christ. Many would not. Some of these faithful were beheaded, suffocated, flayed alive, or hanged in cages in public squares.

5. Fr. Andrew was first arrested in 1835, but his parishioners ransomed him. He changed his last name to Lac, but persecution followed him. He was arrested again, tortured, and finally beheaded in Hanoi on Dec. 21, 1839.


