New Evangelization Corner Doug Herbek



"May we be in this world a ray of that light which shone forth from Bethlehem, bringing joy and peace to the hearts of all men and women." - Pope Francis

- 1. During each of the four weeks of Advent, a new candle is lit near the Advent wreath to express the increasing anticipation and preparation for the arrival of Jesus. The candlelight reminds us of the light of Christ coming into the world.
- 2. The first Advent candle is purple and symbolizes hope conveyed in prophecies about the birth of Christ. The second Advent candle, also purple, stands for peace, pointing to the fulfillment of prophecies of a Messiah who would be the Prince of Peace. The third Advent candle is pink and represents joy, reminding us of the world's joy at the birth of Jesus, and calling us into a time of rejoicing and heightened anticipation as Christmas draws nearer. The fourth Advent candle is purple and signifies love, highlighting God's love for humanity and the call for believers to love one another. In some churches and homes, a fifth candle that is larger and white is lit, reflecting Jesus Christ, The Light of the World.
- 3. In the wreath, evergreen branches, which do not lose their leaves in winter, speak to the everlasting life found in Christ. They are a symbol of hope and renewal, pointing to the promise of eternal life through Jesus.

The second week of Advent we light the "Bethlehem Candle" on the Advent wreath representing Mary & Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. Jesus is coming & so is His kingdom of peace.

Debts are forgiven is the second element of the Jubilee Year of Hope. This is the year where the Lord wants to forgive you radically! Make sure you are receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation often. He is calling you to forgive radically.
