# New Evangelization Corner Doug Herbek



"The Christmas creche . . . shows God's tender love: the Creator of the universe lowered himself to take up our littleness."

Pope Francis

- 1. Saint Francis of Assisi is often credited with having made the first three-dimensional representation of the scene of the birth of Jesus, which has been seen as having provided inspiration for the Christmas creche, also known as a Nativity scene or a manger scene. However, in 1075, Pope Gregory VII presided at a Christmas Mass at which a Nativity scene had been set up near the altar.
- 2. In 1223, in Greccio, Italy, Saint Francis arranged a manger scene with straw and a living ox and a living donkey. He got villagers to play the parts of Mary and Joseph. However, a rag doll was used to stand for Jesus. In this Nativity scene, Saint Francis hoped to inspire the residents of Greccio about the celebration of Christmas.
- 3. Much later in history we saw the actual Christmas creche (from the French word for "crib"), the arrangement of three dimensional figures of Mary, Joseph, the baby Jesus, with an ox and a donkey under a prominent star. It is believed that the Jesuits assembled the first Christmas creche in Prague, perhaps as early as 1562. However, they may have been inspired to make it by the example that Saint Francis gave through his Nativity scene, so we may have our Christmas creches in large part due to Saint Francis.





#### **Ideas For Week 3 Of Advent**

The third week of Advent we light the "Shepherd Candle" on the Advent wreath symbolizing the shepherd's joy when the angels appeared and announced the birth of Jesus Christ. The third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means reioice!

Rest & play is the third element of the Jubilee Year of Hope. In the Old Testament, during a Jubilee Year they even let the land lay fallow. Be intentional about not working on Sundays. Enter into a Sabbath rest.

- Plan a day each month to do something as a family.
- Learn a new hobby.
- -This week consider where your joy comes from: Do you rejoice in God and his good works? Or does your heart love the things of the world–possessions, accomplishments and praise?
- -Slowly decorate your tree. Take your time. Advent is about preparing and waiting. Recall years past and share stories with family. Look at Christmas lights.
- Make homemade ornaments together.
- -Write Christmas cards.
- -Add shepherds to your nativity.
- -Read the history of the nativity scene together.
