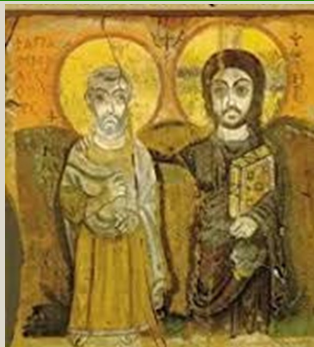

New Evangelization Corner

"I saw the snares the enemy spreads, and I said groaning, 'What can get me through such snares?' Then I heard a voice saying, 'Humility.'"
- Saint Anthony of Egypt

On January 17, we celebrate the feast day of Saint Anthony of Egypt. When, as a young man, he heard Matthew 19:21, he took it as his personal calling, so he sold his possessions and gave the proceeds to those who were poor. Then he retreated to the desert, living an ascetic and often solitary life, imparting wisdom and counsel to those who came to him during his long life from the year 251 to 356.

Saint Anthony is only one of the many Desert Fathers and Desert Mothers who removed themselves to the desert to live predominantly contemplative lives. There are numerous little stories, related in the Sayings of the Desert Fathers and Desert Mothers, from the time of Saint Anthony or soon thereafter. I enthusiastically recommend checking them out online. I've received much helpful guidance from their sayings, especially when I used to be a monk at the Hermitage in Big Sur, which resembles the communities of the Desert Fathers and Desert Mothers.

However, we can apply insights from the Desert Fathers and Desert Mothers, and we can be contemplatives, without being desert ascetics or monks or nuns. We can take little steps to follow their example. We can get up a little earlier than others to spend time in silence, solitude, and stillness to meditate on the Word before starting our days, as one of my current classmates, who has two toddlers, decided to do. If we keep doing so, the Word will shine forth out of us, so that through us, others receive the Light of the World.

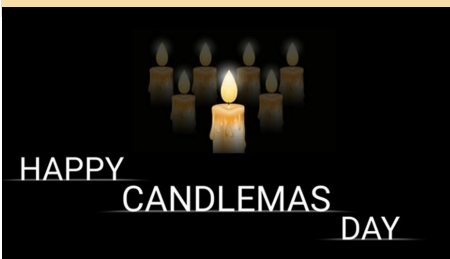
Manger Scenes: Liturgically the manger scenes are taken down in church because it is the start of Ordinary Time, to help keep focus on the liturgical calendar.

However, in your home you can leave the manger scene up until Candlemas (February 2nd).

What is Candlemas:

Candlemas is a Christian festival on February 2nd marking the presentation of Jesus at the Temple 40 days after his birth, fulfilling the Jewish law, and symbolizes Christ as the "Light of the World."

This is the last day that the Vatican keeps up their Christmas tree and creche in St. Peter's square in Rome.

Dear God,

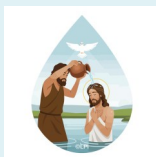
Through Baptism, You called and claimed us as Your own, chosen and loved.

Celebrate Jesus Baptism

Jesus baptism is an example for the rest of us and a sign of his true identity. We also can proclaim our belief in the waters of baptism and our new ongoing life in Christ.

Below is a list of ideas on how we can celebrate and proclaim about Jesus Baptism. This is a great time to share that Jesus is with us always, even when things don't go as planned.

Adult/Family activities:

- ◇ Talk about your baptism or you children's baptism, what happened at the service, who was there, why were those Godparents chosen, and reflect on the day.
- ◇ Quietly or with family, renew your promises made at baptism, possibly lighting your baptismal candle.
- ◇ Use Holy Water and make the Sign of the Cross when entering your home.
- ◇ Pray for spiritual growth and then journal about your journey. An idea to start with is reflect on water's symbolism and see it as a source of cleansing and new life.
- ◇ Read scripture by starting with Matthew 3:16-17. Contemplate each scripture you read, asking if there is a sign of new life.
- ◇ Share a meal. Make a favorite or think of water theme foods.
- ◇ Pray the Luminous Mysteries.

Activities for children:

- ◇ Crafts: Make doves out of paper plates, add their name and baptism date.
- ◇ Role play a baptism with their doll. Talk and reminisce about their baptism.
- ◇ Water relay: a relay where kids carry water in cups, symbolizing new life.
- ◇ Torn paper collage: create sky, dove, water, sand and candle.
