The Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord

This week, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord. As Simeon foretold when Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the Temple, Christ is The Light of all people,¹ symbolized by candles lit and carried during processions on this feast day.

We carry the Light of Christ. If we welcome Jesus into our hearts, the Light of Christ will shine through us, fulfilling Jesus' words, "You are the light of the world."²

We are to be light in a world that often seems dark, as we are tempted to despair due to violence of many kinds. War rages in Gaza and Ukraine, making many into refugees. Other violence causes many others to be fearful, including in Minnesota. Yet be of good courage; Jesus has overcome the world.³ We overcome through the love of God, which is sown in our hearts when we spend time with Jesus every single day, whether in meditating on Scripture or in Eucharistic Adoration. Then we are not anxious, but the peace of God which passes all understanding fills our hearts.⁴ Then the love of God is seen in the Light of Christ shining in us; through us God brings peace to our fractured world.

SAINT AGATHA
MARTYR

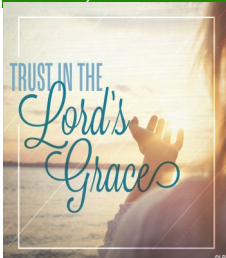
Feast Day
February 5th

Agatha was born in Catania, Sicily, in southern Italy, around the year 230. Like many women of her time, she decided to consecrate her life to Jesus Christ by remaining a virgin.

The governor of Sicily, fell in love with Agatha and sought her in marriage. However, the young woman rejected each of his proposals. The constant refusals greatly annoyed the proconsul who ordered punishment.

Tradition has it that Agatha miraculously survived the horrors and cruelties committed against her, and during the night while she was bleeding to death, St. Peter the Apostle appeared to her to heal her wounds and encourage her to remain steadfast. At dawn, when the guards realized that the woman had recovered, the executioners resumed the tortures and Agatha gave up her life. It was the fifth day of the second month of the year 251.

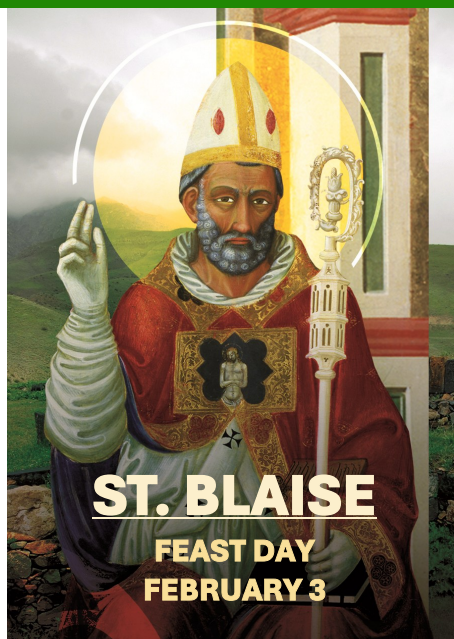

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

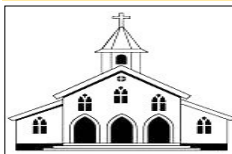
The Old Tyme Country Boys will be playing from 2:00pm-5:00 pm.
